

Missouri River- Watkins Mill State Park via Railroad Corridor



Construction Priority: Third

This 21.91 mile shared use/equestrian route on hard and soft surfaces is adjacent to an active railroad. The route originates at the Missouri River and travels north by Martha La Fite Thompson Nature Sanctuary (1/2 mile southeast of Excelsior Springs Road and MO Highway 152) and travel to the active railroad corridor. Several bridge crossings and stream crossings

and one underpass crossing allow a pleasing change in elevation along the corridor. Several stream crossings occur before the user reaches Glenridge Memorial Gardens. As the user approaches Mosby, farmland changes to residential/light commercial. Continue to Williams Creek Lake and Watkins Mill State Park to complete this route.
